Dr. Samuel Stillman (1737-1807) was an American Baptist minister born in Philadelphia, PA and raised in South Carolina. From 1765 Stillman was minister of the First Baptist Church of Boston, MA until his death. In 1802, Samuel Stillman was instrumental in founding the first Baptist Missionary Society in America (known as The American Baptist Churches of Massachusetts).
